
Editorial NOTE

Asghar Qureshi is the Chairman of "Da'Art Institute of Art & Design"

Q. How did your interest developed in Arts and **Graphic Designing?**

Ans. I belonged to an underprivileged area named as "Layyah" but however I got the chance to have my Arts and Graphics education from Karachi, later my interest dragged me in textiles and I associated myself with different textile programs from Faisalabad. BABUSAR TOF Dazzling Spot of Kaghan Valley

abusar Pass or Babusar Top is a mountain pass at the north of the 150 km. (93 miles) long Kaghan Valley connecting it via the Thak Nala with Chilas on the Karakoram Highway (KKH). It is the highest point in the Babusar valley that can be easily accessed by cars. Babusar Pass connects Khyber Pakhtunkhwa with Gilgit Baltistan province of Pakistan. You can easily reach the Babusar Top via car. While driving through this mountain pass we covered the distance of about 150 meters and reach the Babusar Top at an elevation of 4173 m (13,700 ft). The views from the top were amazing, floating clouds, cool breeze and marvelous landscape.

Standing on the top you might get lucky and get a panoramic view of Malika-e-Parbat on a clear day. Malika-e-Parbat is the highest peak of the district with an elevation of 17,000 feet. There are also astonishing view of snow covered peaks of Kashmir. You can see green plateaus, winding roads; small streams and mountains as far as the sight go. There is also a pinned board with the calculated distances of relatively near cities of China and Pakistan on the top.

From Babusar Top you can make it to Naran by covering a distance of only 80 km. However, Gilgit is located at a distance of 414 km. Furthermore, from Naran you can make your way to Battakundi , Lalazar Plateau, lake Dodiputsar and lake Lulusar. Lake Lulusar is the biggest natural lake in Hazara and the source of Kunhar River. Most part of the road leading to Babusar Top has been constructed and improved for the convenient locomotion. In Chilas you can get guidance about the route from the Northern Areas Public Works Department (NAPWD) executive engineer office and Natco drivers while in Naran. PTDC is a good source of information. Here also, like Kaghan, thick forests are found especially on the higher slopes. Due to extensive exploitation only in unapproachable areas the thick forests are found.

It is highly recommended to come prepared for such trips with stocked food, warm clothes and of course camera to capture snaps of some astonishing landscapes. Always check weather forecasts before travelling. The evenings can be very chilly even in summer. The whole journey to the top is simply memorable. This is one spot of Northern area of Pakistan that you will surely enjoy visiting when you are off to other connecting places like Naran and Gilgit.

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 pack chocolate cake mix
- 1 can (375ml) Coke

METHOD:

1. Preheat oven to 180C (160C fan-forced). Lay out 12 patty pans on a baking tray.

2. Gather your ingredients.

3. In a bowl, using a mixer combine the cake mix with the Coke. Beat for 1 minute.

4. Fill patty pans to 3/4 full and bake for 26 minutes or until a skewer placed into the centre comes out clean. Remove to cool.



3 Ingredient Fruit Cake

This 3 ingredient fruit cake recipe just seems impossible until you see the result come out of the oven and can enjoy a delicious moist fruit cake.

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 kg mixed dried fruit
- 2 1/2 cups (625ml) fruit juice
- •2 cups self-rising flour

METHOD:

1. Place mixed dried fruit in a medium saucepan and pour over 2 cups of fruit juice. Bring to the boil, reduce heat to low and simmer for 3 minutes. Remove from heat and leave to cool for 2 hours.

2. Preheat oven to 150°C fan-forced or 170°C conventional. Line a 20cm round spring form tin with baking paper and set aside.

3. Sift the self-rising flour over the soaked fruit and stir well until completely combined. Use the remaining half cup of juice if needed to make a moist mixture.

4. Pour into cake tin and bake for 2 hours on the lowest shelf. Remove from oven and leave cake to cool entirely in the tin. Wrap in foil and keep in an airtight container for 2-3 days before

FIFA 19 Nintendo Switch Review

IFA 19's game play innovation is precision ball control which, when used effectively, creates new openings through subtle movements, body feints and fancy

flicks. But for every slick piece of control there is an equal moment of miscontrol as the ball gets away from you. It's unforgiving at first, resulting in untidy passages of play with balls bouncing off the knees, chests, and heads of supposed top-class professionals. However, once mastered, the free-flowing football (using the right analogue to lead the ball away from you first time) creates some of the game's most eye-catching moments. Letting the ball run across your body or flicking the ball before hitting a first-time shot adds a new level of satisfaction to attacking play.

The players inside the grounds look better than ever also: little details, like beads on sweat on players' foreheads or the slight rustle of their shirt sleeves on a windy day, add to the atmosphere. They move more fluidly than ever, appearing to sense and react to the ball and the players around them. Defenders will back into opposition forwards to shepherd a ball out of play and will attempt new ways to trap the ball if it comes to them at an awkward angle, making them feel more human as they more naturally adjust to each situation they find themselves in. Players appear to tire slightly more as games go on as well, adding to the realism.

The UEFA competitions also bring with them two new commentators, Derek Rae and Lee Dixon. Although neither will give much of a tactical insight, it is always a bonus to have an extra pair of voices as an alternative to Alan Smith's monotone drawl. The new licenses have been woven into every game mode possible too: the Champions League (and its little brother, the Europa League) can be played as part of the career mode, with former also found in the Kick-Off menu, with each stage available to play separately. Integration with Ultimate Team in the form of live content updates is promised, but at this stage it is unclear whether this will be any more than some in-form FUT cards.

FIFA's Kick-Off mode has been long stagnant, offering little other than standard exhibition matches, but this year it has undergone a substantial overhaul with nine new game modes available. The most memorable can be found in the House Rules section, which is FIFA's answer to Over watch's Arcade. These match types introduce new rule subsets to the core 90-minute match experience and do so to varying levels of success. Some are ripped straight from the playground, such as my beloved Headers & Volleys, while others bring a more anarchic edge to the beautiful game, like No Rules mode. With no offside's, fouls, or bookings enabled, this guickly descends into chaos and there's no denying it's a whole lot of fun. 🗉

Higher Education Commission (HEC) would send the second batch of 36 students including 32 males and four females from Gwadar for one year Chinese language course in Beijing polytechnic University, adding that the first batch of 14 students was sent in March 2018. The Government announced 50 scholarships for Gwadar students in order to meet the local needs emerging due to the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC).



High Housing Prices and Low Tuition Prices for Students in Germany

Student housing in Germany is experiencing a long-term price hike, prompted by high enrolment figures, which threatens the country's status as an affordable destination for learning. According to a report by the German Economic Institute, prices of student housing in major international student cities such as Berlin, Munich and Frankfurt has risen by as much as 67% since 2010. The capital has seen a rise of 10% in just one year, a development Jorick Beijer, director of student housing think tank The Class of 2020, said will change its international reputation.



Inspiring Futures acquires Padworth College

Robots to help teach English in Japan

The Japanese government has announced plans to use robots in school classrooms as part of a new approach to improve its population's English proficiency, and take advantage of an expected increase in tourism. Rolling out in 2019, the trial will see robots implemented in 500 schools throughout Japan, and join a number already using the technology as part of their curriculum. English has become a focus for Japan in recent years, establishing several partnerships globally to improve proficiency in the lead up to the country hosting the 2019 Rugby World Cup and the 2020 Summer Olympics.



World Bank calls for worldwide investment



The World Bank has called on governments worldwide to increase their investment in education after their recently created Human Capital Project found a global learning crisis in preparing the population for the future of work. Unveiled at the World Bank and International Monetary Fund's annual meeting in Indonesia, the report measured countries' success in human capital development, noting significant funding gaps were "leaving the world poorly prepared for what lies ahead". The report's methodology measured human capital by anticipating the outcomes of a child born today against the education they will receive in their home country.
